The 2023 Annual Report for Nurse Aide II courses was distributed to North Carolina Board of Nursing (NCBON) approved courses. Courses had access to the report from March 1, 2024, through March 31, 2024. Data was collected and analysis was conducted by Board Staff. The purpose of this report is to provide a narrative summary of the findings.

Course Types

There were two categories of courses and five sub-types for a **total of 132 courses reporting**.

Community College Courses

- Community College Curriculum Traditional NAII 15% 20
- Community College Career and College Promise 14% 18
- Community College Continuing Education Traditional NAII 53% 69

Non-Community College Courses

- Proprietary School Traditional 15% 20
- Licensed Care Agency (e.g., hospital, long-term care, home care) 3% 5

Course Offerings

A total of 136 full-course offerings occurred in 2023, a decrease of 15% from 2022 and 42% from 2021. A total of 598 students completed the full NAII course, a decrease of 17% from 2022 and 34% from 2021. Few applicants, insufficient faculty, and lack of clinical sites were the reasons provided for these decreases. Two Career & College Promise programs, one Continuing Education program, and one Proprietary program requested closure due to no intention of offering the program at the designated location in the next two years. NCBON closure letters have been provided to the respective Program Directors of the four programs. Of the 132 programs reporting, there are 346 anticipated offerings of the NAII course in the next two years. This was an increase from 115 in 2022.

Admission Requirements

The five standard admission requirements are:

- High School Diploma or High School Equivalency Diploma
- Current NAI Listing
- Immunization Record
- Driver's License
- College Admission Requirement

Other requirements listed include:

- Criminal Background Check
- AHS BLS Certification
- Drug Screen

Curriculum Changes

132 programs reported no curriculum changes.

Curriculum Compliance

There are 457 faculty who teach in NCBON approved NAI courses, an increase of 57 faculty since 2022.

Attestation Questions

The following questions indicate compliance with NCBON NAI Guidelines and Administrative Rules. Unless otherwise indicated, 100% of 132 courses reporting attest to full compliance.

- Classroom and clinical resources are adequate to effectively implement the NAI course.
- At least 80 hours of theory are provided.
- At least 80 hours of supervised clinical experience are provided.
- NCBON-required NAI Modules and Skill Competency Validation Checklists are used as the course curriculum.
- Each module is implemented as designed, including the number of hours required for that module.
- All course material and student information are stored securely with limited access.
- All formal complaints filed with the course have been reported to the Board within 30 days of receiving the complaint.
- Students are under the direct supervision of an NCBON-approved faculty member when providing any aspect of patient care.
- Each NAI faculty member has a current, unencumbered license to practice as an RN in North Carolina.
- Each NAI faculty member has at least two (2) years of direct patient care experience as an RN.
- Each faculty member has experience teaching adult learners.
- A NCBON-approved faculty member teaches all aspects of the course.
- All faculty who teach in the course, at any time, are approved by the NCBON to teach in the NAI course.

- The faculty-to-student ratio in the clinical area is no more than 1:10.
- There is a current contract or agreement between the NAII course/parent agency and EACH clinical agency used for NAII clinical experiences.
- All students in the NAII course have taken NAI testing on the first possible date but no more than 30 days after completing the NAI course.
- Students admitted to the NAII course who did not meet the NAI testing and listing requirements were dismissed from the NAII course immediately upon failing testing or failing to list as an NAI.
- Students admitted to the NAII course were at least 16 and a half years old at the time the course began.
- The agencies used for clinical experiences for CCP NAII students have formally agreed to accept students younger than 18 years of age.
- Students admitted to the NAII course completed the program no more than 60 days from the time they would be eligible to list on the NAII Registry.
- All students validated in the NCBON NAII Electronic Registry System have successfully completed all aspects of the NAII course and have shown evidence of a high school diploma or high school diploma equivalent, and current NAI listing without substantiated findings of abuse, neglect, exploitation, mistreatment, diversion of drugs, fraud, or misappropriation of client or employing facility property as recorded on the DHSR Nurse Aide I Registry or the NC Health Care Personnel Registry.

Competency Assessment

• Proprietary School Competency Assessment	24%	7
• Licensed Care Agency Competency Assessment	3%	1
• Community College Competency Assessment	73%	21

A total of 36 Competency Assessments were offered in 2023 at 29 sites, a decrease of 35% from 2022. A total of five students completed the Competency Assessment, a 95% decrease from 2022. The primary reason stated for this decrease is enrollment was less than the minimum to offer the course.

Attestation Questions

The following questions indicate compliance with NCBON NAII Guidelines and Administrative Rules. Unless otherwise indicated, 100% of 29 courses reporting attest to full compliance.

- The program is approved by NCBON to offer NAII competency assessment.
- Competency Assessment was available ONLY for those NAIIs who have an expired Nurse Aide II listing and who either: 1. Worked at least eight (8) hours for compensation during the past 24 months performing nursing care activities under the supervision of a RN. OR 2. Had a continuous period of 24 months during which nursing care activities were not performed for monetary compensation, but patient care activities were performed for compensation.
- All students validated in the NCBON NA II Electronic Registry System have successfully completed all aspects of the NA II course, and have shown evidence of a high school diploma

equivalent, and current NA I listing without substantiated findings of abuse, neglect, exploitation, mistreatment, diversion of drugs, fraud, or misappropriation of client or employing facility property as recorded on the DHSR Nurse Aide I Registry or the NC Health Care Personnel Registry shall not be eligible for renewal as a nurse aide II.

- All the skills identified on the NA II Task List were assessed, successfully completed, and the NA II was determined competent in the required skills.
- If the NA II was unable to successfully complete the competency assessment, the individual was referred to an approved NCBON NA II course.
