Hurrican Helene Update

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NCLEX Pass Rates

The NCLEX pass rates are sent directly to program directors from NCSBN as an encrypted email message on the 10th day of the month following each quarter. Please ensure your IT department has whitelisted emails from: **pearsonvuebidistribution@pearson.com**. NCBON will continue to post quarterly reports on our website. NCLEX Standard - Single Year

All NCBON approved pre-licensure nursing education programs will be reviewed in 2025 pursuant to 21 NCAC 36 .0320(c), a program shall maintain an NCLEX examination pass rate that meets or exceeds 90 percent of the national pass rate for licensure level on first writing of the licensure examination for calendar years ending December 31. If you have questions, contact your assigned consultant.

NCLEX Candidate Reports

NCLEX candidate reports are distributed via email within six weeks of the candidate's examination date. Program directors are automatically copied on the email distribution. A detailed program performance report can also be provided upon request. The report includes first time and repeat test takers identifying pass or fail candidate status. NCSBN - 2025 NCLEX-RN Standard Setting Panel of Judges

NCSBN is seeking qualified nurse volunteers for the NCLEX-RN Standard Setting Panel of Judges meeting on July 15-17, 2025 in Chicago, IL. The purpose is to discuss entry-level registered nurse (RN) activities. Members of the panel must meet the following criteria:

- RN with an active nursing license in good standing
- · Employed as a nurse for at least two years
- Current clinical practice
- Works with, precepts and/or supervises newly licensed RNs within their first 12 months of practice

Rules Corner

It is crucial to be prepared for emergencies that may disrupt your program's schedule. Events such as COVID-19, flooding, or hurricanes can cause sudden and significant changes, often with little time to plan. Implementing an emergency preparedness plan can help mitigate stress and uncertainty for both faculty and students.

As you create your plans you may want to consider the following: prioritization of student cohorts depending on clinical availability, adjustments to communication needs of faculty and students, educational needs of faculty and students in the event shifts in delivery mode of didactic and clinical content be needed. You are not required to submit your plan to the Board for approval, however, it should be available for review if asked by your assigned consultant.

(b)(11) an emergency preparedness plan for addressing situations which shall include a reduction in the availability of clinical agencies, a transition from in-person to virtual learning platforms, and a need for increased use of simulation.

Does your program have a policy for remediating errors in clinical settings?

If so, is this policy implemented at the beginning of each semester? While guidelines for remediation in didactic courses are well-established, it's equally important to address remediation in the clinical settings. The rule requiring remediation strategies at the start of each nursing course is vital for ensuring patient safety and providing students with due process. By addressing clinical errors early, students can correct mistakes in a supportive environment, while strengthening their critical thinking and clinical judgment. A structured remediation approach helps ensure that students develop the competence and confidence needed to deliver safe, effective care as entry-level nurses.

21 NCAC 36.0321 Curriculum

(h) Remediation strategies for students shall be in place at the beginning of each course and include processes to remediate errors in the clinical setting.
